# A MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO

KIM CORNWELL EP!C CEO

If you feel like all this year we've only talked about legislative issues especially regarding the proposed rate methodology, you'd be correct. It's unfortunate that all my updates have had to revolve around this topic. As of today the Illinois Department of Human Services is planning to implement a new rate methodology for Community Integrated Living Arrangements (group homes) by 3/31/24 that will cut \$2.5 million Direct Support Professional (DSP) hours. This would impact 10% of total service hours across the state and remove \$87.7 million in funding.

This plan to reduce doesn't align with what's best for adults with disabilities. We are seeking your help. Let's make sure the Governor's office and our local Legislators understand how critically important our DSP hours and recommended funding by Guidehouse is to the wellbeing of people with disabilities.

There are deep safety concerns, and the potential impact is troubling. Cutting hours for these dedicated professionals would put our staff and individuals at risk, with potentially severe consequences. Please reconsider this decision immediately."
